Official Step Show Rules

1. All performances must be of good taste and decency
 - a. Music lyrics should not contain excessive profanity or be sexually explicit (radio versions should be utilized where appropriate)
 - b. No element of the show should be offensive to others
2. Entire performance should not exceed 10 minutes
 - a. Time starts immediately after the host announces your team. You will have 2 minutes to set up prior to your performance
 - b. Due to the number of teams, any performances that are longer than 10 minutes may be cut from the final video tape editing
3. Technical Requirements must be submitted by **October 14, 2011**
4. No hazardous, flammable or potentially dangerous materials or props allowed, including but not limited to food items or items that contain bleach, ammonia, slippery substances, or allergens
